## Transcript of Letter from Dr. Kaplan of the University of Calgary

This letter was written on the University of Calgary letterhead by Dr. Kaplan, Director of the Behavioral Institute of the University of Calgary. The letter was read, with her permission, during the Melaleuca January 14, 1999 satellite launch to approximately 150 locations across Canada and the United States. The letter was sent to Frank VanderSloot, President and CEO of Melaleuca Inc. and read by Melaleuca Vice President, Brian McCarmack.

## Dear Mr. VanderSloot;

I am sending this to you personally because it warrants your personal attention. As I believe you know, I have been involved in the scientific investigation into the effects of a combination of nutritional supplements on neurological disorders first brought to my attention by Dr. Brian Cole of the University of Lethbridge.

These supplements involve a combination of several nutritional products which your company currently manufactures which I am sure you are aware.

Our preliminary investigations have been monitored either by myself or those I work with which have totally convinced me that what we have uncovered is a discovery of immense magnitude or importance.

For instance, we have monitored a patient with Chronic Schizophrenia for a period of being on the supplements, off them and being back on them. She experienced a corresponding and remarkable symptom reversal on and off the supplements.

In addition, we have monitored a Fibro-Myalgia patient who has had complete symptom remission after many years of suffering. This case study has been submitted to a Medical Journal for publication.

Also numerous participants of Bipolar Affective Disorder and Depression have now seen complete symptom remission for a very long period of time approaching three years for some, as long as they remain on the supplements. It is this latter point that makes our data so convincing. The results we see cannot be occurring by chance alone. Our results suggest that it is indeed a deficiency of some elements within the body.
