Dear Dr. Roper:

I have not redeived an answer to my letter to you of February 26, 1991.

This week I was given a copy of a letter dated November 19, 1990 from Drs. David T. Dennis and Carlos C. Campbell of the CDC that was sent to state and territorial epidemiologists. Despite the obvious ambiguity of their statements, reference to my name, work, and relationship with the CDC are contrary to fact and are damaging. You understand, I am sure, why I bereby request retraction of their imagguracies, and of the inappropriate use of my name.

It is confusing to me, as it is to others, to read such a letter and compare it with the extensive correspondence to me from the CDC, which offers to provide me with Plasmodium vivax for malariatherapy for cancer, as well as advice on the management of patients with induced malaria.

The Dennis-Campbell letter, by the way, states that antiblotics are effective against CMS Lyme disease, which is not in agreement with recent medical literature.

As always, I wish to continue cooperative endeavors with the CDC. Your inmediate response is desired.
