On [REDACTED] 96, at approximately 1:00 P.M., [REDACTED] came to my office unannounced regarding their experience at the Century Wellness Center (formerly Century Clinic). I had no previous contact with the [REDACTED] and they came to my office of their own accord.

[REDACTED] was diagnosed in 1991 by traditional medical means as having [REDACTED] carcinoma, and had the tumor surgically removed. She felt her cancer symptoms were coming back and went to the CWC (Century Wellness Center) for treatment.

The [REDACTED] wanted to talk to me about their treatment at CWC, and the information contained in this memo was provided voluntarily by them. [REDACTED] was admitted at CWC in the late afternoon on [REDACTED], and filled out various new patient paperwork. She was instructed to put on a paper "gown" and was given a general physical examination by Terri (Teresita O'Gorman), an employee of CWC, who during the course of the exam told [REDACTED] she had a tumor in her abdomen. After the exam, a different employee (unnamed) came into the room and Terri left. The new employee had [REDACTED] lie down on a table and gave her an electrocardiogram, via telephone hook up, followed by a circulatory test using various blood-pressure cuffs attached to various parts of her body. She was then given a test in which the employee placed dabs of a gel-like substance on positions on her feet, hands, and temples, and other locations on her body which [REDACTED] could not exactly recall. The employee had a hand-held object which looked like a probe resembling a "pointer" or "writing pen." There was an electrical cord attached to the "probe" which in turn was attached to some equipment that [REDACTED] was unable to see. The employee proceeded to press the probe to various areas on [REDACTED] body where the gel had been applied. While the probe was being pressed onto her skin, [REDACTED] could hear an electrical "whining or whooshing" sound, similar to the sound of an ultra-sound exam, which would cease when the probe was removed. While pressing the probe, the employee frequently watched a computer monitor which [REDACTED] was unable to see, and when she tried to position her head so she could see the monitor, the employee told her to lie still. She was not told the purpose of the test, or the name of the machine. All three tests were given in the same room. Following the third test, [REDACTED] was told to dress, and then taken to an area where several tubes of blood were drawn from her arm for lab analysis, and a smear of her blood placed on a microscope slide.

She was then taken to a room with a microscope and a "T.V." screen. Present in this room was Katrina Tang, Teresa Ma (identified to her as a licensed Pediatrician), and [REDACTED]. Katrina placed her blood slide into the microscope and the microscope image of it appeared on the T.V. Katrina and Teresa Mall pointed out to her, based on the slide image,

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that she had acute Lyme disease, Herpes I, II, and VI, Epstein Barr disease, Toxoplasmosis, yeast infection, and was full of toxins, infections, and poisons. ██████████ was then given a treatment schedule and began her treatments ██████████

Her treatment began ██████████ morning with three mule kick injections (to release the toxins and viruses in her body so the I.V. therapy could work on them). She said the shots felt like acid being injected into her. The injections were followed by the I.V. therapy which lasts about 3-4 hours. Within one hour after the I.V., an injection is given in the other arm, called "Push." After this initial treatment, ██████████ was given a physical exam by James Forsythe M.D. He told her that according to her blood work, it did not appear that her cancer was coming back.

██████████ continued to receive the treatment daily, with the mule kick injections, I.V. therapy, and the Push injection. After a few days, ██████████ was becoming frustrated because no one would answer her questions as to what was in the injections and the I.V., and would be told "You ask too many questions." When she was about to receive some injections, she expressed her concern as to the contents due to her medical allergies, so the employees agreed to test her for allergic reactions. The test consisted of Terri placing a small crystal pyramid against ██████████ chest, while Terri held her other arm horizontal. An employee then placed a filled, capped syringe into the palm of ██████████ hand, while another employee pushed down on Terri's outstretched arm. They repeated this procedure with several different syringes, separately and all of the syringes together, and then pronounced the injections good for her. Terri said since the other employee was not able to push her arm down that shows the injections are good for her. ██████████ treatments continued.

On ██████████ received her mule kick injections and began her I.V. treatment about 9:30 A.M. This time however, her arm being infused began burning and hurting, and her fingers began swelling and turning blue. After about three hours she demanded the I.V. be removed, which they did under protest. She was told to go back to the waiting room and someone would look at her arm.

During the next 3-4 hours she repeatedly asked for someone to look at her arm, it was severely swollen and her fingers were discolored. At about 5:00 P.M. an employee looked at her arm and said it was all right, rubbed an ointment on it and wrapped it in gauze. Immediately after, Terri called her into an examining room and gave her a "Push" injection and prepared to give her another injection called "Fireburner". ██████████ protested receiving the injection and wanted to know what was in it, but Terri said she knows what is best and gave it to her in her hip area anyway. ██████████ said this hurt more than the mulekick and within one minute her muscles in the area began to spasm. She said she could barely stand. She told Terri about the reaction, and was told to go back to her hotel and take a vinegar bath. At about 6:15 P.M., ██████████ called the CWC from her motel because the burning and muscle spasms were increasing and moving down her leg and up her body. She explained her reactions and said she needed to come back and see Dr.

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Forsythe or Katrina. She was told that Dr. Forsythe had already left and Katrina would see her a week from Tuesday. [REDACTED] told them if no one would see her at CWC, she was going to the hospital.

With some of her lab analysis records in hand, she asked the motel manager to call her a cab to take her to the hospital. Before the cab arrived, her spasms increased and she went into convulsions and passed out. The manager then called 911 and she was taken to St. Mary's Regional Medical Center Emergency by ambulance, and was treated and stabilized by James Allen M.D. [REDACTED] told Dr. Allen she was being treated at CWC for lyme's disease, Herpes 6, toxoplasmosis, etc., and after review of the records she brought him said they were treating her for lymphoma, and according to the lab results, she did not have the other diseases/infections.

On [REDACTED], she returned to CWC and was seen by Dr. Forsythe who looked at her arm and told her that some people have bad reactions to homeopathic medicine, and thought it best if he sends her home with take home injectable medication. That evening at 8:30 P.M., [REDACTED] had a conference with Katrina. Also present were Terri, Teresa Ma, [REDACTED]. Katrina told her that she was not going to treat her anymore because she required too much care, was scaring off other patients, and was giving off "bad vibes."

[REDACTED] returned at 9:00 A.M. the following morning, [REDACTED] to obtain her medical records, but the receptionist could not find them.

[REDACTED] told me that she had accompanied her friend [REDACTED] to the clinic last September, and although not diagnosed or treated, was told by Katrina Tang that cancer is caused by viruses and other toxins in the body, and they don't treat cancer but they eliminate the viruses and toxins, thus curing the cancer. She also said that she was only tested with the device with the hand-held probe and the gel, once, but had heard if you stay longer you are tested with it about every 3-4 weeks.
